Skybus has made a commitment to sustainability by signing on as a pledge signatory to the UITP (International Public Transport Association) Charter on Sustainable Development in October 2004. Skybus has recently led the way in public transport by joining Greenfleet to offset all of its carbon emissions. Greenfleet will plant in excess of 5,400 trees annually on behalf of Skybus.

The following water, waste and energy targets have been set:

Water Management

- Reduce mains water usage by 50% by 2010 (from 2006 levels).

Waste Management

- Solid waste to landfill reduced by 15% (from 2006 levels).

Energy Management

- Office and depot energy use reduced by 15% by 2010 (from 2007 levels)
- Fuel Offset 1,783.7 tonnes of CO₂-e.

Other

When travellers choose to ride on SkyBus between Melbourne's Tullamarine Airport and the city they leave a smaller carbon footprint. As Melbourne's official airport-to-city public transport service, SkyBus moves more than 2 million passengers every year. SkyBus express buses make an average of more than 210 trips daily. They run 24/7 and depart every 10 minutes during the day.

With transport being a growing source of greenhouse gas emissions, SkyBus believes it's important for the company to reduce its 'ecological footprint' while continuing to provide a fast, reliable and frequent service.

Consequently, SkyBus buses feature low-emission engines, and the company is also working towards implementing a broader sustainability program to complement its fuel off-set; its continued partnership with Greenfleet is an important part of that process.

SkyBus is definitely a greener way to travel.
